Scouts will hit the beach for hands-on exploration of our local Great Lake. Tracking waves, sifting sand, and hunting for fossils are just a few of the activities included.

Water Watchers (Year-round)

Scouts will travel the world as a water drop, become water detectives to discover who is a water waster, and learn how everyone can help prevent water pollution.
